Member School's Code of Ethics
Updated February 2013

- Member schools will abide by the intent of HB 325 by providing a means for qualified students to receive a preK-12 grade education from an accredited private school in Georgia through the awarding of funds available via the Qualified Education Expense Credit.
- Member schools will be transparent with their financial aid and admission policies.
- Member schools will not modify their school's admission criteria to accommodate students who would qualify for Qualified Education Expense Credit scholarship but not qualify under the current admission criteria at their school.
- Member schools will not modify their school's financial aid criteria, in whole or in part, based on a student's achievement in co-curricular areas such as arts and athletics because of the Qualified Education Expense Credit scholarship program.
- Member schools will maintain confidentiality in regards to specific information about a student's financial situation and scholarship award amounts.
- Member schools will ask each recipient and their family to maintain confidentiality in regards to specific information about a student's financial situation and scholarship award amount.
